Items with * are considered **optional** but may make camping more enjoyable.

*Note 1: Reusable cutlery is preferred. Trash must be packed out. A mess kit can be a cheap set or reusable plastic plates and old mismatched silverware... A Scout is thrifty!

Camping Do's!

- ✓ Each child participating must be accompanied by an adult.
- ✓ If an adult attends who is not a parent/guardian, the accompanied child must sleep in a tent alone or with other scouts close in age.
- Cubs may sleep in the same tent as long as they are no more than 2 years apart in age and are the same gender (this applies to cubs sleeping in their own tent and not in a family tent).
- ✓ Always watch out for your child and know where they are at all times.
- ✓ Cub scouts must use the buddy system at all times or be accompanied by a parent/guardian. Enforce the Buddy System always. Make sure your child is with a buddy and knows they are if they are not physically right there with you. They will need constant reminding.
- ✓ Store food, candy, toothpaste in an air-tight container.
- ✓ Get your cub to do as much of the work in camping as possible (help putting up the tent, carrying stuff, etc).

Camping Don'ts!

- Never be in a tent with a child who is not your own. Adults and scouts should never be in a tent that is not their own.
- No alcohol anywhere, anyhow, anytime.
- No smoking/tobacco use of any kind, (including vaping) designated spaces are provided away from camp.
- No firearms. While state laws may authorize individuals to legally carry or conceal firearms, they are NOT permitted to carry them while involved in Scouting activities outside of the shooting sports program.
- No pets.
- No open toed shoes!
- Oub Scouts should not have knives in Lion, Tiger and Wolf ranks. Bears and higher ranks can only bring pocketknives if they have completed the Whittling Chip pocketknife achievement and if they also bring their Whittlin' Chip card or badge. No knives with a blade longer than the width of a child's palm.
- Leave behind Nintendo DSs, iPods, or other electronics / game systems. This is the kids' opportunity to get away from all that. Besides, they could get damaged or lost.
